Sir

Dr Beaumont, after waiting some time for your answer to his letter, proposing to you to come to him again, & serve out your engagement, was obliged to return to Jefferson Barracks, at St Louis. & will not be back again till next Spring. He left word, that if you answered his letter & concluded to abide by his proposals of leaving your family there for the present, & come out yourself & go with him, to write back to you. & say, that you might stay with

your family till about the middle
of April, & then meet him here,
prepared to go with him.

And He also said, if you refused
to come without your family, ^{or} you
asked for more money than he had
already advanced, ^{or consented to} ~~proposed to~~
let you have when you had
to him; that you might remain
when you were, without expectation
of any ^{but} ~~more~~ assistance, or consid-
eration from him. Enjoying the
fruits of ingratitude & injustice as you
could - He will not advance
you any more money, till you
come to him, & manifest a sincere
disposition ~~to~~ faithfully to serve
out your ~~contract~~ ^{engage-ment} to him &
fulfill his expectations of you.

When you have done that,
he will reward you, justly &
amply & equal to your ^{expectations} ~~work~~
you will oblige him, by making known
your final determinations soon as possible
& consulting them to me at ~~his pleasure~~ to be
