The course covers *reputable* online health information, mostly from MedlinePlus.gov and KidsHealth.org.

We continue the course in conjunction with the Family Resource Center at St. Louis Children’s Hospital.

We have taught 126 participants, the vast majority being K-12 librarians in the St. Louis metropolitan area.
