Information for Poster Presenters

Conference Registration: One author must register for the conference. If assistance is needed with registration fees, please contact Consuelo Wilkins, MD at CWilkins@dom.wustl.edu.

Poster Presentations: All posters should be placed on the poster boards by 8 AM, Monday September 26 and taken down by 4 PM on Tuesday September 27. Poster boards are located in room Eric P. Newman Education Center atrium along the wall of windows and will be available for viewing during both days of the conference.

The conference program will indicate a number corresponding to the poster board to use. You should be present at your poster during specified viewing times in the program.

Poster boards are 45 inches (tall) x 91 inches (wide) and 1 poster will be on each side of the board. Tacks for placing posters on poster boards will be provided.

When preparing posters, the following guidelines for text characteristics may be useful:

Content	Reading Distance (feet)	Bold Type Size (millimeters)
Title	15-20 (far)	30-45
Authors, Affiliations	15-20 (far)	25-30
Main Headings	6-8 (medium)	10 (36 pt)
Sequence Numbers	6-8 (medium)	25-50
Text	3-4 (close)	5 (24 pt)
