- The [Community Research Fellows Training Program](#), part of the Program for the Elimination of Cancer Disparities, will host a **certificate ceremony and reception honoring their fellows** on Thursday, Aug. 8, from 6 to 8:30 p.m. at the Eric P. Newman Education Center. Forty-five fellows, all community members with an interest in research and the health of their communities, recently completed a 15-week curriculum focused on community-based participatory research methods. These classes were led by Melody Goodman, PhD, MS, along with her research team and faculty guest speakers from the School of Medicine, Becker Medical Library, the George Warren Brown School of Social Work, and the College for Public Health & Social Justice at Saint Louis University. Next, the fellows have the opportunity to impact community-based participatory research in a unique way. "After completing the program, fellows are able to form equitable research partnerships with academic researchers to produce studies that are relevant and important to community members with appropriate scientific rigor; this has the potential to develop interventions that are culturally competent and region specific as we work to address disparities in health," says Dr. Goodman.
