**PHYSIOLOGICAL PHONETICS**

All students will have the opportunity of reconstructing, in the laboratory, the position shown with modeling clay. These processes of modeling will be made simple enough for all to be able to utilize the same.

**PRONUNCIATION OF AMERICAN ENGLISH**

A consideration of the so-called correct and incorrect pronunciation norm. Modifications which must be made in the indication of dictionary pronunciation. A study of the main types of cultivated American pronunciation. Geographic distribution of differences found therein. Bearing the whole has on instruction of the Deaf Child and the mature Hard-of-Hearing.
