your favour of the 4th inst last covering
draft for one hundred dollars duly come to hand. Mr. J. M. Martin
was about and is still so - he was daily
expected - which has been the cause of my not writing
sooner. Joethesis left for the States - and was to have

thinks that he has pushed on to St. Louis. A few days
more will decide - whether he returns or not. from
the U. S. should he return then I can - use your
draft, if he leaves for your quarters, and should he
not go - by some mischance or other. I will
return you the draft. I am apprehensive that
something has happened to thesis - unless he has gone
to St. Louis - I will write again - as soon as
matters have cleared up the way about of Martin.
